In 2019, Travis Peterson began the expansion of Meadowlark Brewing from Sidney to Billings. The original brewery had reached its capacity for the canning process, and Travis wanted to supply their products to additional retailers. Unfortunately, the project faced setbacks when the COVID-19 pandemic struck, causing supply issues and increased project costs. Despite these challenges, the project persevered and was completed, opening its doors in 2022.

Although Meadowlark was able to start brewing and canning its products, obtaining the licensing necessary to serve the public took roughly a year.

Meadowlark Brewing faced additional challenges when expanding, especially hiring and retaining employees. Travis drew upon a variety of resources - such as the BSTF Planning and Job Creation grants, the SBA 504 lending program, and the SBDC for help with projections and business planning to make Meadowlark's vision a reality. SBDC Regional Director Lorene Hintz was able to help Travis access the grant needed to offer new employees competitive, living wages. They have created 12 fulltime and 36 part-time jobs in Yellowstone County and have roughly a 50-50 split in equity and loan funds for a \$5,000,000 project.
