



#### **Export Express Loan**

Loans are typically approved within 36 hours and can be up to \$500,000.



#### **Export Working Capital Loan**

These loans can be up to \$5 million, and the turnaround time is usually five to 10 business days.



#### **International Trade Loan**

Combination of fixed asset, working capital financing, and debt refinancing The maximum loan is \$5 million.
